

Classification of Rimfire Sporter Rifles



This gun is a TU-Class gun if the adjustments can be done without tools. Otherwise, it is a T-Class gun if tools are required.

These guns are not allowed in 4-H competition due to the wrap-around shroud on the fore-end and extended magazines.
