



Market Barrows and Gilts

Berkshire (Based on American Berkshire Association Breed eligibility requirements)

- The ideal color pattern is black with six white points (face, feet, tip of tail). Less desirable, but acceptable, are sandy colored hair in the areas where white and black border.
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Three of four legs MUST be white.
- Must NOT have a solid white or a solid black face from the ears forward.
- Must NOT have a spotted or mottling pattern.
- Must NOT have red skin/hair anywhere on the pig's body.
- Must NOT have a contiguous area of white and/or red skin/hair that exceeds 64 square inches anywhere on the body.
- Must NOT have a full or $\frac{3}{4}$ belting pattern.
- Ears MUST be erect.

Chester White (Based on CPS Breed eligibility requirements)

- Must possess Chester White Breed characteristics.
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Must be solid white in color, no color on the skin larger than a silver dollar, no colored hair.
- Any skin pigmentation other than white that exceeds five (5) in number are disqualified.
- Ears must be down and medium sized.
- Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such ear tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification.
- There are no underline requirements to exhibit Chester white barrows or gilts as market animals.

Duroc (Based on NSR Breed eligibility requirements)

- Must be red in color and possess Duroc breed character. Ears must be down.
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Must NOT have any white hair located on the animal.
- Must NOT have any black hair located on the animal.
- Must NOT have more than three (3) black spots on the skin, and none of these spots can be larger than two (2) inches in diameter.
- Must NOT have any shading or indication of a belt.
- Must have no evidence of an extra dewclaw.
- There are no underline requirements to exhibit Duroc barrows or gilts as market animals.

Hampshire (Based on NSR Breed eligibility requirements)

- Must be black in color with a white belt starting on the front leg. The belt may partially or totally encircle the body. Animal is eligible if it has a black head and the body is totally white.
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Must possess Hampshire breed character (ears must be erect and not rounded).
- Must NOT have any white hair or indications of streaking on the forehead.
- Must NOT have any red hair.
- Must NOT have any evidence of an extra dewclaw.
- There are no underline requirements to exhibit Hampshire barrows or gilts as market animals.

Hereford (Based on CPS Breed eligibility requirements/Oklahoma Youth Expo Rulebook)

- Must be red, light, or dark red with at least 50% white face, at least 50% red body, and at least 2 white feet.
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Ears must break forward.
- Any size of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such ear tags are determined to not be permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

Landrace (Based on NSR Breed eligibility requirements)

- Must be white in color and possess Landrace breed character (ears must be down).
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Must NOT allow any color hair other than white.
- Must NOT allow more than three spots of skin pigmentation.
- Must NOT allow any spot of skin pigmentation larger than one U.S. minted quarter.
- Must have no evidence of an extra dewclaw.
- Must have at least six functional udder sections on each side of the underline. Pin teats and inverted nipples are not considered functional.

Poland Chine (Based on CPS Breed eligibility requirements)

- Must possess Poland Chine breed characteristics (ears must be down).
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Must be black with six (6) white points (face, feet, and tail switch).
 - Tail docking is permissible.
 - An occasional splash of white on the body is permissible.
 - A hog may not possess more than one (1) solid black leg.
- Must NOT have evidence of a belt formation or either white hair or skin.
- Must NOT have red or sandy hair and/or pigment.
- Any size of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such ear tags are determined to not be permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

Spotted (Based on CPS Breed eligibility requirements)

- Must be black and white and possess Spotted breed characteristics.
- Must be ear notched within 7 days of birth.
- Ears cannot be erect.
- Must NOT have any red tinted or brown spots.
- Head must NOT be solid black from the ears forward.
- Must NOT possess a white belt pattern (hair or skin) that encompasses the back 1/3 of both shoulder blades and extends down to the foreleg of the animal. The belt pattern is not completely broken by black. Exception to this rule is a predominately white-bodied individual with a white face.
- Any size of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such ear tags are determined to not be permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

Yorkshire (Based on NSR Breed eligibility requirements)

- Must be white in color and possess Yorkshire breed character (ears must be erect).
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Must NOT have any color hair except for white.
- Must NOT have more than two pigmentation spots larger than a U.S. minted dime or one pigmentation spot larger than a U.S. minted quarter. The pigmentation spots (combined) can NOT exceed a U.S. minted silver dollar.
- Must show no evidence of an extra dewclaw.
- There are no underline requirements to exhibit Yorkshire barrows or gilts as market animals.

Breeding Gilts

Berkshire (Based on American Berkshire Association Breed eligibility requirements)

- Must meet all requirements listed for market Berkshires.
- Gilts must possess six (6) functional teats on each side of the underline. Pin teats and inverted nipples are not considered functional.
- The presence of one or more swirls on the upper half of the body are NOT allowed.

Chester White (Based on CPS Breed eligibility requirements)

- Must meet all requirements listed for market Chester Whites.
- Gilts must possess six (6) functional teats on each side of the underline. Pin teats and inverted nipples are not considered functional.

Duroc (Based on NSR Breed eligibility requirements)

- Must meet all requirements listed for market Durocs.
- Gilts must possess six (6) or more functional teats on each side of the underline. Pin teats and inverted nipples are not considered functional.

Hampshire (Based on NSR Breed eligibility requirements)

- Must meet all requirements listed for market Hampshires.
- Black in color with a white belt totally encircling the body, including both front legs and feet.
- Animal can have white on its nose as long as the white does not break the rim of the nose, and when the mouth is closed, the white under the chin can NOT exceed what a U.S. minted quarter will cover.
- White is allowed on the rear legs as long as it does NOT extend above the tuber calis bone (knob of the hock).
- Hampshire swine classified as off-belts may be used for breeding purposes, with offspring eligible for registration with the NSR. Off-belts will continue to be eligible to be shown in market hog classes, but will not be eligible for exhibition in breeding swine shows.
- Gilts must possess six (6) or more functional teats on each side of the underline. Pin teats and inverted nipples are not considered functional.

Hereford (Based on CPS Breed eligibility requirements/Oklahoma Youth Expo Rulebook)

- The majority (51%) of the face must be white; both skin pigment and hair.
- The animal must have at least three (3) white legs where both skin pigment and hair encircle the entire leg above the hoof.
- The body must be at least two-thirds red; both skin pigment and hair. There shall be no white touching the spine of the animal from the back of the shoulder blade to the ham-loin junction.
- Gilts must possess six (6) or more functional teats on both sides of the underline. Pin nipples and inverted nipples are not considered functional.
- There shall be no connecting belt anywhere on the body.
- Any animal having five (5) black spots larger than one (1) inch in diameter, or any one spot exceeding three (3) inches in diameter will be disqualified.
- Yellow Skin pigment and hair, as well as a predominately roan color patten and gray/silver hair on the body will be disqualified.

Landrace (Based on NSR Breed eligibility requirements)

- Must meet all requirements listed for market Landraces.
- Gilts must possess six (6) or more functional teats on each side of the underline. Pin teats and inverted nipples are not considered functional.

Poland China (Based on CPS Breed eligibility requirements)

- Must meet all requirements listed for market Poland Chinas.
- Gilts must possess six (6) or more functional teats on each side of the underline. Pin teats and inverted nipples are not considered functional.

Spotted (Based on CPS Breed eligibility requirements)

- Must meet all requirements listed for market Spotted swine.
- Gilts must possess six (6) or more functional teats on each side of the underline. Pin teats and inverted nipples are not considered functional.

Yorkshire (Based on NSR Breed eligibility requirements)

- Must meet all requirements listed for market Yorkshires.
- Gilts must possess six (6) or more functional teats on each side of the underline. Pin teats and inverted nipples are not considered functional.
